Why Clean Up the Parish?

- When the parish community gathers as a family we all can take on active roles
- Parishes can establish a 'green team' to prioritise ways parishes can clean up!





Parish Clean Up – Activity 1 1. Inside the church...The parish that cleans together stays together!

We would appreciate very much if you could volunteer on Saturday.... (insert date) for an hour or two to help clean up our Church.

- If the parish has its own vacuum cleaner this can be used –(if another is needed the organisers will advise)
- Bring your own duster, wipes etc

2. Parish Clean Up – Church Grounds-Second Activity

- Invite parishioners to help to 'clean up' the Church environment.
- This can involve weeding, cutting grass, keeping paths clean
- Consider adding...
 - Compost Bin
 - Bee/Butterfly garden boxes and planting - boidiversity
 - A Garden seat contemplation area





3. Clean up the Parish – Check List

Parish clean-up takes place on (Date) and time

- We are looking for volunteers to help to tidy up and clean up our parish area.
- We will provide bags for the litter pick up or you can use your own bin liner.
- Bags can only be left for collection in designated areas.
- Let the parish 'green' coordinator know which road, street, area you can do – this helps with co-ordination.
- Check the parish website/social media for the areas we hope to cover
- It is recommended to use gloves
- Please like and share to spread the word..

- Decide on a date and time
- Create a 'WhatsApp' group just for this project
- Contact and inform your local civic authority/county council/refuge collectors – sometimes they have incentives eg gloves, bags etc
- Involve families, local schools
- Ensure all bags/rubbish collected is brought to appropriate 'dump'.
