Some things to consider as we begin to reflect together on social justice:

- 1. Who are we now, as parish? How has our community changed? Do we actively reach out to all?
- 2. What are our needs in this area? What are the needs of our parish community our elderly, sick, vulnerable, our young people, our young families? What are the needs of those beyond our church doors those on the margins of our community?
- 3. What social justice groups are active in our parish? Have we a St Vincent de Paul (SVP) group, a bereavement group, a visitors group, friendship / active retirement group?
- 4. How do we reach out to support the poorest? Have we local initiatives? Do we support Crosscare, Focus Ireland, Trócaire?
- 5. How can we raise awareness of social justice issues and challenge social injustices? Do we have a Justice & Peace group? ...a Care of Creation or Eco group? Would we consider starting a Justice, Peace & Integration of Creation (JPIC) group (or subgroup of the PPC) to focus initially on education and awareness of our mission as people of God to further justice in the world?
