In the Book of Psalms it is written: 'Let his house become deserted and may no one live in it'. And again 'May another take his office'. Therefore we must choose someone from among those who were with us during all that time that the Lord Jesus moved about with us, beginning with John's baptism until the day that Jesus was taken away from us. One of these has to become with us, a witness to his resurrection.

Prayer is central to the life and growth of the community. DDPC members recognise the importance of both private and personal prayer.
